



General Information

The following information acts as an overview of what to expect in preparation for your safari.

Once your personalised booking has been placed, FAS will supply you with a customised 'safari bible' containing comprehensive travel information, specific to your safari.

Personal Items to Pack

Clothes / Toiletries / Medical - FAS will provide specific advice on what to pack, including appropriate clothing, basic toiletries, medicines, photographic equipment etc, each of which may differ depending on the areas you choose to visit in Zimbabwe.

Weather

Guests should be aware that the Southern Hemisphere temperatures are hot, often reaching 35 degrees celcius in the hotter months (Sept – Apr). However, in the cooler months (Apr-Aug) certain safari areas experience severe cold, particularly in the evening hours in the Winter months, with temperatures dropping sub-zero.

Travel Documents

Passports & Visa

Visa requirements and travel documents differ from country to country. FAS does not facilitate arrangement of any travel documentation for guests travelling to countries within FAS's safari remit, i.e. to South Africa, Zimbabwe, or Mozambique. Guests of FAS are therefore strongly advised to check these requirements well in advance of booking a safari, with your travel agent or relevant African Embassy, and to ensure that ample time is allowed for preparation of appropriate Visas before travelling.

Clients are responsible for ensuring that their passports are valid for the duration of their travels : bear in mind that some countries require several months validity before allowing entry/exit.

Travel Arrangements

Vehicle Transfers

FAS facilitates booking of vehicle transfers to and from

airports and relevant safari areas, within the remit of FAS's defined Executive and Explorer Safaris. Certain transfers are included in the rates for Executive Safaris and all transfers and vehicle travel is included in the rates for Explorer Safaris. Executive and Explorer Safaris have relevant sections on the Website defining their remit.

Flights

International & Safari Charters - Charter flights are not included in the general rates quoted for Executive or Explorer Safaris as quoted on the FAS Website. These are quoted individually on request, and will be included as a seperate item on your final safari quotation.

Guests are responsible for the booking of ALL International travel arrangements and flights relating to your safari. Where return tickets have not been pre-booked, it is the guest's responsibility to carry sufficient funds to book and pay for these, once in Africa. Bear in mind that some Airport and Travel Agent facilities in Africa do not facilitate credit card payments, and are only able to receive payment in cash.

Insurance

It is the responsibility of the guests to ensure adequate personal and family insurance cover for your belongings and for yourself, including full medical, repatriation and emergency air evacuation.

Money & The Use of Credit Cards

Guests are advised to carry cash in small denominations. Bear in mind that many safari destinations cannot process a Visa card. FAS will advise you more specifically of how to transact on safari, with details specific to your safari destinations, when you place your booking.
